Bro. Whitsun Albert McDonald, CD; JP: Saintly in character, liberal in spirit, vigorous in mind, with a heart imbued with a passion for justice, he served our Fraternity for over seventy years with loyalty, honour and distinction. In your official acts he was governed by a keen sense of duty, coupled with a unique grasp of human problems. He always sought to help his fellowmen in the hour of need and for those reasons he had gained and maintained the admiration, esteem and affection of the Fraternity.

Initiated in the Glenlyon Lodge No. 346 SC in 1942 he became Right Worshipful Master in the Administrative year 1950-1951. He held the office of Treasurer for 26 years and was awarded the honour of a Distinguished Service Member. As a devoted member of the District Grand Lodge of Jamaica he held many offices, rising to that of Senior District Grand Warden. His meritorious service to the District Grand Lodge did not go unnoticed, as he was awarded with the Grand Rank of Hon Grand Jeweller by the Grand Lodge of Scotland, on the recommendation of the District Grand Lodge of Jamaica. In recognition of his service to The Glenlyon Lodge, an agenda item on the July meeting of the calendar of the Lodge since 2005 has been designated as the Annual Whitsun McDon-

record at the monthly meeting of the Glenlyon Lodge, and its General Committee was impeccable. At all these meetings he always exercised sound judgment, and offered wise council in the deliberations among the brethren. His zeal, fidelity, personal sacrifice and allegiance to our Fraternity knew no limits.

Blessed with courage, understanding, initiative, vision and a saving sense of humour he has lived a life so full of accomplishments that few can match the honour and respect associated with his name.

Bro Whitsun McDonald served his country faithfully and zealously as a Public Servant rising to high office as Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Housing in the 1970's. While there he was responsible for a wide range of innovative policy initiatives to improve the lives of the Jamaican people by facilitating access to housing for many Jamaican families. He was the brainchild behind one of the most recognizable and influential public bodies in existence today, the National Housing Trust. For his tireless efforts, unfading loyalty to the Fraternity, and the sincere affection he had shown to

the Brethren, we take this opportunity on the occasion of his passing to The Grand Lodge Above to tender this citation as evidence of the high esteem in which he is held by all members of the Fraternity in general and the Glenlyon Lodge No. 346 S.C. in particular. A Mason for seventy two years, the like of our dear Brother may not been seen again. Though diminutive in stature, he was a giant among men and all are better by having known him.

The family and the Brethren of The Glenlyon Lodge no. 346 S.C., endured another great loss with the passing to the Grand Lodge above of one of its illustrious Brethren, Bro. John Alfred Pickersgill. Bro John was initiated as a member of The Glenlyon Lodge no. 346 S.C. on the 10th of August 1983, passed to the Second Degree on the 12th of October 1983 and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on the 13th of June 1984. He became Right Worshipful Master on the Lodge on for the administrative

year 2009/2010. He was also the First Principal of The Glenlyon Royal Arch Chapter no. 762 in the administrative year 2010/2011.

Bro Leon Robertson P.M. in giving a tribute to our dear departed Brother said that, "as a Freemason and a member of The Glenlyon Lodge, he built a temple of honour and virtue of unselfish devotion to duty. His was a life of service to our Lodge and Brethren, and verily and truly exemplified the spirit of our fraternity (i.e. to help the needy, succor the distressed and to support everything that is fine and noble. His impact on the younger Brethren of the Lodge was profound, and he was held in enviable esteem by all".

In his private avocation Bro John was an employee of the Coffee

Industry Board for seventeen years retiring as General Manager. During his service he oversaw an almost ten fold increase in coffee production as well as significant expansion of the processing capacity of the Coffee Industry Board. He was instrumental in developing a strong and durable relationship between the Jamaican Coffee Industry and the Association of Japanese Importers of Jamaican Coffee, as well as Specialty Coffee Association of America. "Mr Pick" as Bro John is remembered by his colleagues in the coffee industry, was known as the consummate gentleman, decent human being who always had the welfare of his staff as a priority.

Bro Leon Robertson on behalf of the Brethren of The Glenlyon Lodge, paraphrasing the words

of the late Most Worshipful Bro. Otto Klotz, Honorary Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Canada, 1876, paid this tribute to Bro John; "If you see a man who quietly and modestly, moves in the sphere of his life, who without blemish fulfills his duty as a man, a subject, a husband an a father, who is pious without hypocrisy, benevolent without ostentation and aids his fellow man without self interest, who heart beats warm for friendship, who serene mind is open for licensed pleasure, who in vicissitudes does not despair, nor in fortune will be presumptuous, and who will be resolute in the hour of danger, you would have found the ideal of a Freemason, "Our Bro John was such a man". He will be dearly missed by all who knew him.

There was a time when the Bible formed almost the only literature of England; and to-day, if it were taken away, that literature would be torn to tatters and shreds. Truly did Macaulay say that, if everything else in our language should perish, the Bible would alone suffice to show the whole range and power and beauty of our speech. From it Milton learned his majesty of song, and Ruskin his magic of prose. Carlyle had in his very blood, almost without knowing it, the rhapsody and passion of the prophets---

their sense of the Infinite, of the littleness of man, of the sarcasm of Providence; as Burns, before him, had learned from the same fireside Book the indestructibleness of honour and the humane pity of God which throbbed in his lyrics of love and liberty. Thus, from Shakespeare to Tennyson, the Bible sings in our poetry, chants in our music, echoes in our eloquence, and in our tragedy flashes forever its truth of the terribleness of sin, the tenderness of God, and

the inextinguishable hope of man.

My brethren, here is a Book whose scene is the sky and the dirt and all that lies between--- a Book that has in it the arch of the heavens, the curve of the earth, the ebb and flow of the sea, sunrise and sunset, the peaks of mountain and the glint of sunlight on flowing waters, the shadow of forests on the hills, the song of the birds and the colour of flowers. But its two great characters are God and the Soul, and the story of their eternal life together is its one everlasting romance. It is the most human of books, telling the old forgotten secrets of the heart, its bitter pessimism and its death-defying hope, its pain, its passion, its sin, its sob of grief and its shout of joy---telling all,

Take this great and simple Book, white with age yet new with the dew of each new morning, tested by the sorrowful and victorious experience of centuries, rich in memories and wet with the tears of multitudes who walked this way before us--- lay it to heart, love it, read it, and learn that God hath made us for himself, and unquiet are our hearts till they rest in Him. Make it your friend and teacher, and you will know what Sir Walter Scott meant when, as he lay dying, he

asked Lockhart to read to him. "From what book?" asked Lockhart, and Scott replied. "There is but one Book!"
