The Brethren of The Glenlyon Lodge No. 346 S.C., endured another great loss with the ascent to the Grand Lodge Above of another of its illustrious Brethren, Brother Samuel E. Brother Samuel was Stewart P.M. Initiated as a member of The Glenlyon Lodge No. 346 S.C. on May 13, 1987 Passed to the Second Degree on September 9, 1987 and Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on March 9, 1988. He was Installed as Right Worshipful Master of the Lodge for the administrative year 1998/1999 on December 9, 1998 He was also the First Principal of The Glenlyon Royal Arch Chapter, No. 62; Past Worshipful Commander Noah, Most Excellent Commander and President of The Glenlyon Lodge and Council Chapter No. 62; Thrice Illustrious Master of The Glenlyon Cryptic Council; and Past Wise Sovereign of the St Andrew Sovereign Chapter No. 237.

In his private avocation Bro Samuel Stewart was a well respected career Civil Servant who entered the Public Service in 1957 as an accounting clerk in the Post and Telegraphs Department. Due to his exceptional work, he was eventually promoted to several senior positions in the Public Service. These included Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Housing;

Post Master General of Jamaica; Comptroller General in the Ministry of Finance; and as a Public Service Commissioner. Due to the high esteem in which he was held by his contemporaries, he was appointed to serve on the boards of many public bodies including the Government Savings and Loans Bank; the Jamaica Co-operative Credit Union League ltd; The National Housing Trust; the Caribbean Housing Finance Corporation; and as a Trustee of the Executive Agencies Pension Scheme. Bro Samuel Stewart is especially remembered for his role as President of Jamaica Civil Service Association, an entity whose goals and objec-

tives are to secure better working conditions for civil servants. Having served his country as a dedicated civil servant for over forty years, Bro Samuel Stewart was bestowed with the national award of the Order of Distinction (Commander Class).

But sadly the Lord decided that this venerable and well loved Brother will no longer be with us. He is survived by his loving wife Lorna, his children Michael, Lincoln, Richard, John and David, Brothers Dennis and Joseph, Sister Donna, grandchildren and other relatives. The Brethren of The Glenlyon Lodge have lost a dear Brother and friend and his presence and wise counsel will be terribly missed. Having given over twenty-seven (27) years of exceptional and unselfish fraternal service he was to be honoured at the Lodge's October Regular meeting; Alas, it was not to be. But the Brethren may take comfort that The Glenlyon Lodge had as a brother an outstanding man and Jamaican as one of its most revered members. He will always be re-

membered for his faithful devotion to duty, his zeal for freemasonry, his studied and experienced guidance, and his faithfulness to his family, his friends and his Brethren.

May his soul rest in peace and light perpetual shine upon him!!

The Whitsun McDonald Lecture Celebrates Eight Years

Since 2005, the Brethren of The Glenlyon Lodge have sought to honour annually, the sterling service to Freemasonry by Brother Whitsun Albert McDonald P.M. The brainchild of Bro Christopher

Robinson P.M, who was the R.W.M at its inception, this annual lecture series has become the standard for Masonic Lectures in Jamaica. The Whitsun McDonald Lecture has had many distinguished presenters including the District Grand Master of Jamaica, Bro Lloyd R. Moore.

Topics presented at the lecture have frequently raised much debate, serious contemplation and even some masonic humour over the years. Topics such as whether there should be a "Grand Lodge of Caribbean", that occupied the thoughts and minds of Brethren regarding Lodge Administration, or the relationships between Jamaica's formative Secondary Schools and their links to Freemasonry that have even rekindled intense albeit friendly old school rivalries.

The Whitsun McDonald Lecture has this year taken on added significance as the eighth iteration of this venerable Glenlyon tradition will be undertaken after the ascension to the Grand Lodge Above of our dear and venerated Brother. It was therefore fitting that a Brother from The Glenlyon Lodge was assigned the honour of becoming the eighth Whitsun McDonald Lecturer. The honour for this year resides with a well respected and venerated master of the craft. Bro. Robert Woodstock P.M.

It is indeed a testimony to the Lodge's devotion to Masonic duty and tradition that the Lodge in time honoured fashion, has used the Whitsun McDonald Lectures to pass the light of Freemasonry to a new generation of masons. As an instrument of Masonic Education, the Whitsun McDonald Lectures are unrivalled, and are commonly used as a teaching tool to inspire the Brethren. As the Lodge seeks to inspire the next generation of Freemasons, the Whitsun McDonald Lectures will remain a timeless reminder of that Brother who was saintly in character, liberal in it, vigorous in mind, with a heart imbued with a passion for justice of the mark he left on us all.

Profile on the Eighth Whitsun McDonald Lecturer Bro Robert V. Woodstock P.M.

The great honour of being the eighth Whitsun McDonald Lecturer has fallen on Bro Robert V. Woodstock P.M. P.D.J.G.W. Bro. Robert V. Woodstock P.M., was Initiated into Freemasonry in The Glenlyon Lodge on the 8th of February, 1984, Passed to the degree of Fellow of Craft on the 11th of July, 1984 and Raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason on the 12th of September 1984. He was installed as master of The Glenlyon Lodge No. 346 S.C. on the December 12, 1990.

Bro. Woodstock has given exemplary service to the Lodge over the past 25 years and is well known particularly for his mastery of Masonic ritual and protocol. His excellence in that regard was recognized by the District Grand Lodge by his appointment as District Junior Grand Warden.

His example of excellence is also well known in his private avocation as a much sought after and award winning architect. with over twenty-eight (28) years experience practicing architecture in Jamaica and the Caribbean. He is a partner in the firm Harold Morrison & Robert Woodstock Associates Limited, a design-oriented architectural, planning and interior design

firm operating from Jamaica and Barbados. He was the recipient of a Jamaica Government Scholarship to Cornell University, graduating with a B. Arch., Professional Degree in 1979. He received the American Institute of Architects School Medal and the Certificate of Merit from the Henry Adams Fund for Excellence in Design and the Study of Architecture, for coming first in the class of 1979.

Bro. Woodstock returned to Jamaica to work for the Government of Jamaica at the Ministry of Construction (Works), rising from Intern Architect to Deputy Project Director for an architectural, civil/structural and electrical/mechanical engineering team. Bro Woodstock joined Harold Morrison Associates in 1985 and has been with the firm ever since. The firm has won numerous awards in the Jamaican Institute of Architects' Awards Programme He is Immediate Past Chairman of the Association of Commonwealth Societies of Architects in the Caribbean (ACSAC), Former Vice President (Alternate) for the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), Past President of the Jamaican Institute of Architects (JIA), Past Chairman of the Joint Consultative Committee for

the Building and Construction Industry of Jamaica (Jamaica Chamber of Commerce). He currently chairs the Architects Registration Board, the Membership Committee of the JIA and is a member of the Institute's Executive Council. He has presented a number of papers on construction contracts, contract administration and architectural and urban design. We thank him for sterling service of The Glenlyon Lodge and for being the eighth Whitsun A. McDonald Lecturer.






